Sardinia is an ideal haven for history enthusiasts, beckoning those with a penchant for uncovering the ancient stories etched in its landscapes. Independent travellers seeking off-the-beaten-path discoveries will find solace in the island's unspoiled beauty and authentic charm. For families seeking a unique blend of relaxation and exploration, Sardinia emerges as an idyllic retreat. Whether it's

discovering ancient ruins together or enjoying snorkelling adventures along pristine coastlines, the island provides a curated experience for all generations.

Sardinia is the perfect haven for open-minded wanderers yearning to explore an unspoiled Mediterranean jewel.

When to go

Tuscany is a year-round destination, Sardinia beckons exploration throughout the year, with each season offering a unique experience. The peak season is from Jun-Aug, with temperatures ranging from 28°C - 32°C, perfect for beach enthusiasts, yet can be hot for those who primarily want to sightsee. Shoulder seasons, Mar-May and the second half of Sep-Oct, unveil the island in full bloom, with pleasant temperatures and vibrant local festivals. This is the ideal time to visit, all while benefiting from lower costs. While it is possible to visit in the low season, Nov-Feb, we do not recommend this. If you do decide to visit, you will be met with cooler weather, many accommodations will be closed and archaeological sites offering reduced hours.

How to get there

Plane: To reach Sardinia, air travel is the optimal choice. The island is served by 3 major airports (Cagliari, Olbia, and Alghero). For a well-rounded exploration, we recommend you start your journey in Cagliari and conclude in Olbia.

Ferry: The island is well-connected by ferries from the Italian mainland. The ferry ride duration can vary, with crossings from ports such as Genoa, Livorno, and Civitavecchia taking around 7-9 hours. Ferries are also available from neighbouring islands, providing diverse travel options.

Car: Guests can easily explore the island by renting a car upon arrival with the flexibility of picking up at one airport and returning to another, allowing for a seamless road trip. While driving in Sardinia is generally not difficult, the island's winding roads and limited English speakers in some areas may present challenges. For a hassle-free experience, Ormina Tours recommends arranging private transfers.

Things to consider

- There is a stark contrast in accommodation styles between the north and south of Sardinia. While the north boasts resort-style hotels with all-inclusive amenities, the south offers a charming array of renovated historic buildings and boutique accommodations.
- As a relatively new destination for international tourism, Sardinia has less developed tourist facilities and lower levels of English proficiency. With no main freeways, expect longer driving times on winding roads.
- For those seeking an extended island-hopping adventure, ferry trips from Sardinia to Corsica are available, offering a unique blend of Mediterranean cultures. Important to note that most flights out of Corsica go only to France.

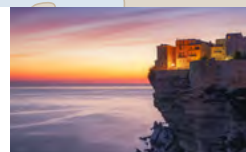

Antiquity unveiled at Nora

Journey into antiquity at the archaeological ruins of Nora. First settled by the Phoenicians and subsequently the Carthaginians and Romans. Here, there is a well-preserved amphitheatre still used for concerts. You will also find preserved mosaics, baths, the forum, temples, and villas, making for an intriguing journey back in time. The history of Nora combines with the fine seaside setting making this a worthwhile stop.



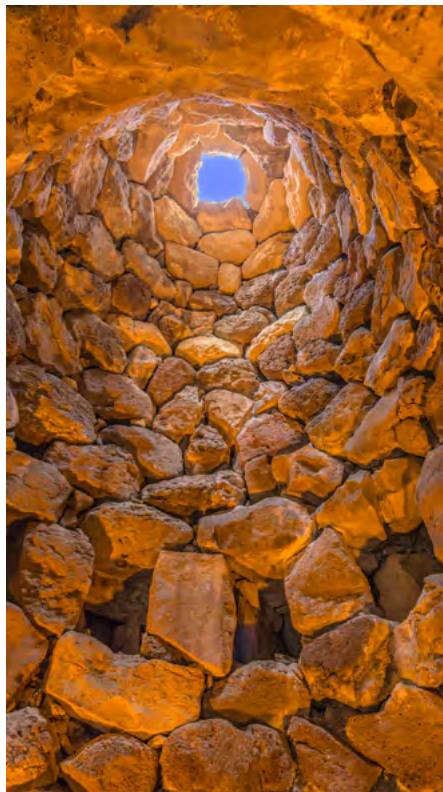
Uncover the secrets of ancient Barumini



One of the most unique features of Sardinia's landscape are the Bronze Age stone towers and walls of the nuraghe. Built around the 12th century BC, these megalithic monuments are dotted across the island. The complex at Barumini is the finest example. It was given status as a UNESCO World heritage Site in 1997. Visitors can explore the fortress by passing through tunnels carved into the walls.

The murals, initiated by a local art teacher, were an attempt to redirect local children away from crime. The old tannery buildings now house shops and restaurants. 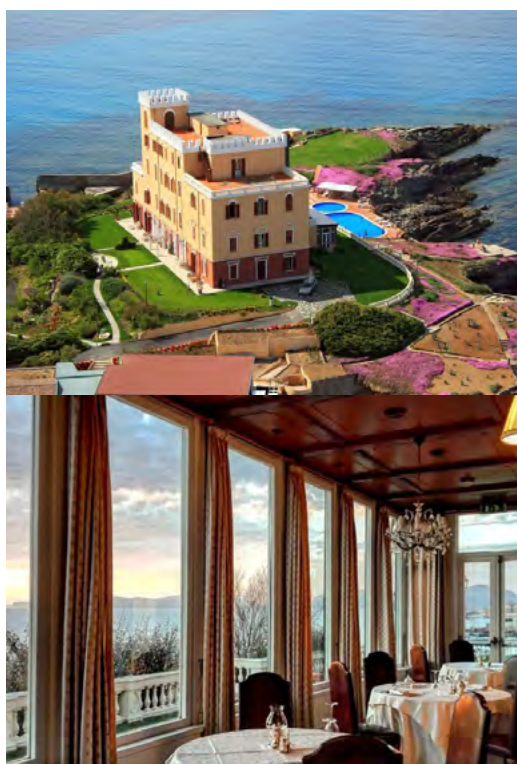

Faro Capo Spartivento Chia



Perched on the rugged southwestern coast, the Capo Spartivento Lighthouse, erected by the Italian Navy in 1854, underwent a captivating transformation into an exclusive 5-star hotel. 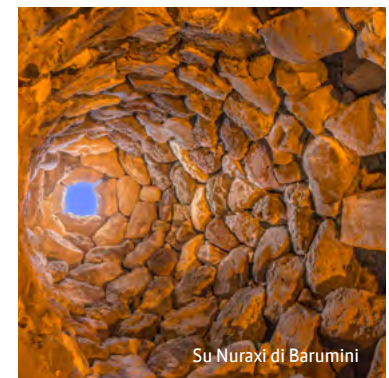
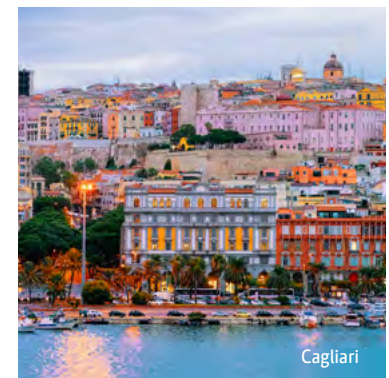

Day 7 Calvi – Agriates Desert – Saleccia – Bastia (B, L)

Embark on a 4WD adventure along mountain ridges to the Col de Battaglia, for breathtaking views. Descend to the wild Désert des Agriates and remote Saleccia Beach. Enjoy a picnic of Corsican specialties before continuing via the scenic Teghime Pass to Bastia by evening.
